



LETTER OF INQUIRY GUIDELINES FOR GRAMMY MUSEUM[®] GRANT PROGRAM ONLINE NOW OCT. 1, 2017, IS DEADLINE FOR SUBMISSIONS

WHAT: The **GRAMMY Museum[®] Grant Program**, generously funded by the Recording Academy[™], has awarded more than \$7 million to nearly 400 noteworthy [projects](#).

The Grant Program administers grants annually to organizations and individuals to support efforts that advance the **archiving and preservation of the music and recorded sound heritage** of North America for future generations, as well as **scientific research projects related to the impact of music on the human condition**. Recipients are determined based on criteria such as merit, uniqueness of project, and the ability to accomplish intended goals.
