WHY: GRAMMY In The Schools Live! incorporates elements of several GRAMMY Museum Foundation education programs, including GRAMMY Camp, GRAMMY Museum Summer Session, GRAMMY Career Day, and the Music Educator Award. GRAMMY Camp offers selected high school students an interactive nonresidential summer music experience. Focusing on all aspects of commercial music, this unique opportunity



provides instruction by industry professionals in an immersive, creative environment with cutting-edge technology in professional facilities. The program offers eight music career tracks: Audio Engineering; Electronic Music Production; Music Business; Music Journalism; Performance–Instrumental; Performance–Vocal; Songwriting; and Video Production. All tracks culminate in media projects, recordings and/or showcase performances. Funds help support scholarships to program participants. **The 2019 GRAMMY Camp application deadline is March 31, 2019.** Financial assistance is available to qualified applicants. GRAMMY Museum Summer Session is a part of a suite of education programs that take place at the GRAMMY Museum inside the Clive Davis Theater. This program provides **developing songwriters** the resources necessary to build a solid foundation in songwriting with instruction and counsel from industry professionals.

The **Music Educator Award** was established to recognize current educators (kindergarten through college, public and private schools) who have made a significant and lasting contribution to the field of music education and who demonstrate a commitment to the broader cause of maintaining music education in the schools. A joint partnership and presentation of the Recording Academy and the GRAMMY Museum, this special award will be presented on the Recording Academy's GRAMMY Salute To Music Legends® PBS special. The deadline to nominate a teacher for the seventh annual award is **March 15, 2019.**
